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CUSTOMER FOCUS

As a CDON customer, you should always feel safe in the knowledge that every product for sale on our marketplace complies with the current statutory requirements.

It is of the utmost importance that sellers of these products keep themselves up to date and ensure that all necessary documentation and certification is kept close at hand in case of random checks. If it appears that one of our partners has failed to comply with the statutory requirements, CDON reserves the right to either remove the products in question immediately, suspend sales activity and/or take any additional action deemed to be necessary.



Special permission must be obtained from CDON before the product groups below may be presented for sale on the marketplace:

- Toys
- Child car seats
- Beds and mattresses
- Electronic products
E.g. chargers, power cables, batteries, lights.
- Groceries
- Medicines
- Children's products
- Multimedia products
- Adult toys

TOYS

The sale of toys is subject to strict regulations in terms of safety, documentation and labelling. The European Commission has produced guides to clarify whether products can be regarded as falling within the category of 'toys'.

It is the responsibility of the seller to keep up to date with the laws applicable to selling toys.

All toy products sold on CDON Marketplace must comply with the legislation currently applicable to toys.

Included in the criteria applicable to these products are that they must:

- Have a DoC (Declaration of Conformity).
- Carry a traceable label which can be linked to the DoC.
- Carry the correct product warnings and instructions in Swedish.
- Be CE-marked by the manufacturer.
- Be marked with the address of the manufacturer
- Be marked with the address of the importer.

In addition to the above, the law also stipulates that toys intended for sale comply with the following requirements:

- The toy must be safe.
- Toys for young children should meet specific safety requirements.
- The toy must remain safe for the entire period in which it is expected to be used.
- The toy must carry the correct markings and warnings.
- The toy must not present a risk to the child when used either in the intended way or in such a way as might be expected in accordance with the behaviour of children.

CHILD CAR SEATS

All car seats, booster seats/cushions and carry cots sold on CDON Marketplace must be approved with an E-mark in accordance with either the current EG directives or ECE regulation **44-03**, or a newer version thereof.

In 2014, a new marking by the name of **UNR129** or **i-Size** was released, which will in the future replace **ECR R44**. However, the two markings will exist concurrently for a number of years to come.

BEDS & MATTRESSES

All furniture sold in Sweden is covered by the Product Safety Act (**2004:451**), which places demands on traders to ensure that the products they sell to consumers across the country are safe.

If a company intentionally or negligently violates its obligations under the Act, the Consumer Agency may apply to the administrative courts for the company to be ordered to pay a penalty fine. The penalty fee is a minimum of SEK 5 000 and a maximum of SEK 5 million.

COTS

All cots sold on CDON Marketplace must comply with the current European safety standards, which are:

- **SS-EN 716-1:2008 + A1:2013**
Furniture for the home: Infant beds, including children's folding beds.
Part 1: Safety requirements
- **SS-EN 716-2:2008 + A1:2013**
Furniture for the home: Infant beds, including children's folding beds.
Part 2: Testing methods

Current regulations stipulate, for example, that:

- The bed should not have any loose, missing or damaged bars or parts.
- The bed should allow a maximum of 65 mm between the bars along the side of the bed and a maximum of 25 mm between the slats at its base.
- Any corner posts may stick up only a few millimetres at most.
- There should not be any shapes cut into the head- or footboard.
- The mattress should be firm and cover the entire base of the bed.
- The bed should have a marking which shows that it meets the **EN 716** standard for infant beds.

FOLDING BEDS

There are various standards relating to folding beds:

- **SS-EN 1129-1** Folding beds: Safety requirements and testing. Part 1: Safety requirements
- **SS-EN 1129-2** Folding beds: Safety requirements and testing. Part 2: Testing methods
- The standards for bunk beds and high sleeper beds also apply to folding beds: **SS-EN 747-1:2012 + A1:2015** and **SS-EN 7472:2012 + A1:2015**

 The **SS-EN 1129-1** and **SS-EN 1129-2** standards do not cover the risk of falling. The Consumer Agency's view is that, in order for them to be considered safe, folding beds with one or more bunks higher than 600 mm must meet the requirements for fall protection provided in the standard for bunk beds and high sleeper beds.

TRAVEL BEDS

All travel beds must meet the current **EN 716** standard for infant beds.

MATTRESSES

In order for mattresses to be saleable to consumers, they must comply with the Product Safety Act and have passed fire safety tests.

- The requirement for upholstered furniture is the current **SS-EN 1021-1** standard.
- The requirement for upholstered beds and mattresses is the current **SS-EN 597-1** standard.

BUNK BEDS & HIGH SLEEPER BEDS

To minimise the risk of accidents to children in particular, various standards have been laid out for bunk beds and high sleeper beds.

The Consumer Agency has carried out market surveys on several occasions, as a result of which many serious shortcomings have been discovered with regard to bunk beds. The agency considers it important that the requirements of both standards are met in order for beds to be considered safe.

The standards which apply in Sweden are:

- **SS-EN 747-1:2012 + A1:2015**
Furniture for the home:
Bunk beds and high sleeper beds.
Part 1: Requirements for safety, strength and durability.
- **SS-EN 747-2:2012 + A1:2015**
Furniture for the home:
Bunk beds and high sleeper beds.
Part 2: Testing methods

Some of the requirements which make up this standard are as follows:

- Only one opening allowing the child to climb into or out of the bed is permitted. This should be located in one of the long sides of the bed.
- The standard also lays out safety requirements for the size of openings, along with other details to prevent the risk of children getting stuck.
- According to the standard for bunk beds and high sleeper beds, these are not considered suitable for children under the age of six. There should be a permanent marking on the bed stating this in either text or pictogram form.
- The safety board must be of a sufficient height such that the top of the mattress is at least 160 mm lower than the upper edge of the board. There must be a permanent marking indicating the maximum height of the mattress which may be used in the bed.
- Since it is common for children to sleep in bunk beds or high sleeper beds, to minimise the risk of the child falling out, the standard specifies a requirement for safety boards on all four sides of the bed where the base is 600 mm or more above the floor.

CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS

BABY WALKERS

Baby walkers cause many accidents and injuries due to children falling down stairs with them. The European standard established in the spring of 2005 requires that a baby walker should stop at the top of the staircase if a child is about to push it over the edge.

When, in 2008-2009, the Consumer Agency carried out its latest inspection, it found that 6 of the 11 walkers tested failed to meet the statutory requirements.

All baby walkers intended for sale must comply with the current **SS-EN 1273** standard.

CHILD SAFETY GATES

All child safety gates intended for sale must comply with the **EN 1930** standard.

BABY CHANGING TABLES

All baby changing tables intended for sale must comply with the current **EN 12221** standard relating to the use of such tables in the home.

DUMMIES, HOLDERS & BOTTLES

- All dummies intended for sale must comply with the **EN 1400** standard.
- All dummy holders intended for sale must comply with the **EN 12586** standard.
- All dummy bottles intended for sale must comply with the **EN 14350** standard.

ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS

All electronic products sold in Sweden and the European Union must be CE-approved. The seller is responsible for product safety and compliance with statutory requirements. The seller shall furthermore possess all necessary documentation required for the sale of the product, including, for example, the EU declaration (DOC). Products are considered electronic if they require a power supply via an electrical outlet or battery.

PRODUCTS REQUIRING AN ENERGY RATING



In a large number of product categories, the product page on CDON Marketplace must be updated with the correct energy class and consumption labels. The categories requiring energy class labels are:

MEDICINES

Only sellers who have both received permission from the Swedish Medicines Agency for the sale of medicines and created an in-house testing programme may apply to sell medicines on CDON Marketplace.

GROCERIES

All sales of groceries on CDON Marketplace must comply with the laws and regulations applicable in Sweden and the European Union.

ADULT TOYS

Special permission must be obtained from CDON before products falling within the category of adult toys may be sold on CDON Marketplace, including vibrators and dildos.

MULTIMEDIA PRODUCTS

Before any of the following products may be sold on CDON Marketplace, special authorisation must be obtained from CDON:

- CD's/records and/or any other media for the distribution of music.
- DVD's/BLU-RAY's and/or any other media for the distribution of film.
- Videogames, gaming consoles and their original accessories.
- Books in either physical or digital form.

FORBIDDEN PRODUCTS

Under no circumstances may the following products be sold or marketed on CDON Marketplace:

- Used products, not including demo products (these products should be clearly marked as demo products when marketed).
- Animals.
- Drugs and controlled substances (including but not limited to narcotic substances or other products that are or can come to be classed as a narcotic product). Items intended for use in connection with narcotics, drug paraphernalia (including but not limited to, pipes, bongs, needles).
- Fireworks and explosives, flammable products.
- ID's and other official documents.
- Refrigerant-products that require installation by an authorized service technician.
- Stolen products.
- Controlled- and/or dangerous chemical products or substances (including but not limited to pesticides, biocides, plant protection chemicals). Approved cosmetic products are excluded.
- Condoms and other medical products that does not comply with all rules and regulations in the territory.
- Any and all products that can be considered offensive or promotes hatred.
- Pirated/counterfeited products and bootlegs.
- Products that does not meet all applicable health-, safety- and environmental requirements.
- Tobacco / E-cigarettes.
- Alcoholic beverages.
- Weapons, hereunder guns and ammunition.
- Currency, coins, bills, securities, bonds, stocks, bills or other similar financial products.
- Products that have import/export restrictions.
- Fur, animal body parts.
- Products including ingredients/parts from endangered animal species.
- Radioactive products.
- Human body parts.
- Lottery tickets.
